INXITE HEALTH SYSTEMS RELEASES VERSION 8 OF THE INXITE® DATA PLATFORM

The new and improved Version 8 of the INXITE® data platform is a multi-tiered upgrade to our previous software. There are multiple new features that address user issues and is a fully functional upgrade to the programs.

There are new navigation buttons added to our dashboard that allow users to navigate through the system easier and will improve accessibility. There is a new chatbot that can create items on the patient record such as medications, appointments and care team members.

The health risk assessment has been updated with new categories and questions added to improve whole-person analysis. New patient accounts will automatically have an HRA waiting for them to complete when they first login.

Patients now have all their document uploads in a shared storage medium. As they infrastructure becomes more involved, patients will still have access to their critical documents. We have also added a new section for help and support. Users can now send requests for support through the application. We have added places for video, FAQs, as well as a tab for introduction where users can view the welcome message from their first-time login. Patients can also add their own notes to their record and have the ability to mark those notes as either private or public.

Our QR is a unique feature and we have made it even easier to use. Users can now share their data via QR codes. QR codes can share predefined or custom data selections. QR codes can be shared via email or text message. Users can download and share an "Emergency Card" that contains basic medical information and a QR code to access more detailed and up-to-date information.

A new recommendations module has been added. This module has information on available products related to the patient's medications or health issues. The goal is to have resources, education, and care team information provided in this module.

Another new feature is a self-enrollment process that will allow anyone to register for an INXITE® account. This requires first and last name, email, phone number, DOB, gender, and address. The user will now receive a welcome email after signing up for an account.

Once the user has signed up, there will also be a suggestion to visit our YouTube channel for how-to videos on the INXITE® app. In addition, the user may access any of the InXite Health Systems videos. We are always looking for ways to improve our products and make this an easy and beneficial process for our users. Look for continued updates in the near future.

CEO IN THE SPOTLIGHT

InXite Health Systems CEO, James Paat, has gained the attention of the media. Recently, he was a guest on The Spectrum with Colleen Marshall. He NBC4I news team visited the InXite Health Systems corporate headquarters to see exactly how the INXITE® data platform works. They were amazed at the difference this makes for patients and providers. James was a guest on the how and he shared how the data platform empowers the patient to decide how their records are shared with medical providers. The discussion also talked about how Medicaid and Medicare are searching for solutions to the management of health-care records and the INXITE® platform is a solution to their problem.

The Columbus Dispatch also did a feature story on InXite Health Systems and how CEO James Paat has been invited to showcase the INXITE® data platform at the White House. Paat has already met with government officials in Washington, DC and will soon be returning to showcase the INXITE® platform and how it can help implement the White House MyHealthEData initiative. MyHealthEData was launched last year by the White House with participation from various agencies, including the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services and the Department of Veterans Affairs. The aim is to give patients control of their data and be able to share it with providers.

The INXITE® platform does just that. "It collects patient health-care data from various sources and gives providers access so each has a complete picture of that patient." Paat said. "INXITE® has the ability to access data from health-care networks with massive IT departments, independent doctors with small electronic records systems and even providers who keep patient information on paper," Paat added.

The goal is to change the current health-care paradigm to focus on patients and engage them to manage their health.

"The idea is that by empowering the patient and having the patient be engaged with their own health care, they're the ones making the right decisions, they're the ones improving health outcomes and lowering costs, so that's the big shift," Paat said.

The article also highlighted where InXite Health Systems is working on projects with insurers, providers and coalitions addressing rural health care in Tennessee and Native American care in Arizona. There is also interest from Mexico, China and India. The arenas are limitless for InXite Health Systems.

CommonSpirit has locations in 21 states: Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Georgia, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Minnesota, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Texas, Washington and Wisconsin.
